JOURNEYS OF PAUL IN TURKEY

Day 1 & 2 — Depart USA to Istanbul, Turkey

Your pilgrimage begins as you board your international flight for **Istanbul**. Our representative will greet you at the airport and help you transfer to your room for overnight.



Day 3 — Istanbul and Adana

Istanbul, the bejeweled capital of Turkey, sits between two continents and is home to 450 mosques. Visit the famous Blue Mosque, with its six minarets and sparkling interior. The Topkapi Palace, once the home of royal Sultans, will give you a glimpse of ancient luxury with its fabled jewels of the Treasury, delicate displays of Chinese porcelain in the

Kitchen Quarters, and its provocative **Harem Quarters**. Experience the reverent beauty of **St. Sophia Church** (Hagia Sophia). Built from 532-537 AD, it was the largest church in Christendom for a thousand years. Featuring 107 columns, fossilembedded white marble floors and beautiful glass mosaics, it is now home to the **Museum of Byzantine Art**. Savor the aroma of exotic spices as you explore the **Grand Bazaar**, where over 4,000 shops sell everything from herbs to gold. In the afternoon you will fly to **Adana**, known as the "biggest village in Turkey" because of its small-town atmosphere. Also located in Adana is **Incirlik Air Base**, home to 5,000 US service men and women.

Day 4 – Antioch (Antakya)

Ancient **Antioch** was the center of Hellenistic civilization in the region as well as home to a massive temple and oracle complex dedicated to the pagan god Apollo. The temple functioned until the visiting Emperor Justinian threw out the last remaining priest and ordered the place burned to the ground. Many Jerusalem Christians fled to Antioch after the death of



Stephen (Acts 11: 19-21,) and Paul and Barnabas stayed there for a year, assembling with the church and teaching many people (Acts 11: 22-26). Later, the city became the epicenter for Paul's missionary journeys (Acts 13). Distinguished as the city where the disciples were first called "Christians," the Antioch church was also the first to accept non-Jews as fellow believers.

Day 5 - Tarsus and Side

Tarsus was the birthplace of Paul (Acts 22:3), and he visited it on both his second and third missionary journeys. Discover the resplendent history of the city of Tarsus that reaches back to the 14th century BC. A beautiful coastal drive will take you to **Side** to spend the night. While in Side, explore the **Roman ruins** of the Byzantine period, including the theater and the baths.

Day 6 - Aspendos, Perge, and Hierapolis

The **Aspendos amphitheatre**, known for its outstanding acoustics, is extremely well-preserved and still in use today for special events. Nearby is **Perge**, a Hellenistic city where Paul preached (Acts 14: 25) on his first missionary journey with Barnabas. The ruins of a large stadium, baths, and a tomb give ample evidence



of Perge's former grandeur. Hierapolis is blessed by hot mineral springs and some of the best-preserved Roman ruins in Asia Minor. Paul mentions Hierapolis in his letter to the Colossians in saluting Epaphras, a fellow laborer, for his love of the brethren there (Colossians 4: 13). The ruins of Hierapolis cover more than a mile and include the city gates, column-lined streets and arches as well

as an impressive **amphitheatre** with seats still in perfect condition. In modern times, the area has become known as **Pamukkale** ("Cotton Castle") because of its cascading white-edged terraced pools, naturally formed by limestone-laden hot springs .

Day 7 - Colossae, Aphrodisias, and Laodicea (Denizli)

In church history, **Colossae** has the distinction of being both the home of Philemon and Onesimus, as well as the destination for Paul's Letter to the Colossians. The town itself has fallen into obscurity, though you can still see traces of the theatre, the **Necropolis** and the **Church**. Not far away is **Aphrodisias**, famed for its marble statuary and structures including the **Odeon** and large stadium. Its **temple of**

Aphrodite was the major center for worship of the pagan goddess until 500 years after Christ. Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches mentioned in Revelation, was known for its banking, textiles, medical school and spiritual arrogance. Chastising the church for being neither hot nor cold (Rev. 3: 15), Jesus entreated them to repent (Revelation 3: 19-21): "As many as I love, I rebuke and heaster, healed I strand at the deer and known.



chasten...behold, I stand at the door and knock..."

Day 8 - Ephesus

Ephesus is another of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev. 1: 11). In ancient days, Ephesus was a bustling port town graced with wide, colonnade-bordered streets and a population of 250,000. Thanks to some spectacular excavations, you can now experience much of the glory of ancient Ephesus, including the huge Agora and Library. The Temple of Artemis was declared one of the Seven Wonders of the World but today, only a single column remains to mark the site. The Basilica of St. John, traditional site of his grave, offers a compelling panorama of the area. Explore the Museum of Ephesus for an up-close look at ancient artifacts. You will have plenty of time to explore on your own and recreate some of the footsteps of Paul.

Day 9 - Smyrna (Izmir), Thyatira (Akhisar), Sardis, and Philadelphia

Today's itinerary covers four of the seven churches mentioned in Revelation. Izmir (known as Smyrna in Paul's time) is the third largest city in modern Turkey, and the church located there was encouraged to be faithful even when suffering (Rev. 2: 8-11). The next stop is Thyatira, a busy trading center renowned for its distinctive purple dye. In Revelation, the church at Thyatira was reprimanded for tolerating the false prophetess, Jezebel (Rev. 1: 11; 2: 18-29). As you head down the road to once-prosperous Sardis, you will be struck by the immense size of the temple of Artemis, massive gymnasium, and the largest synagogue of the ancient world. Like these once vibrant ruins, the Sardis church was dead even though it appeared alive. In Philadelphia, Christ told those who overcame that He would write upon them "the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is the new Jerusalem." (Rev. 3: 17-13). Although only an ancient wall and the remains of a Byzantine basilica are left to mark the church in Philadelphia, Revelation's words to the seven churches still resonate today.



Itinerary Continued

Day 10 - Pergamum (Bergama) and Troas

Another of the seven churches mentioned in Revelation (Rev. 2: 12), Pergamum displeased the Lord for tolerating "the deeds of the Nicolaitans" that Christ hated (Rev. 2:13-17). A great center of classic Greek culture, Pergamum prided itself on its fabled Acropolis, towering a thousand feet above the city, as well as its Royal Gates, Grand Theatre, Gymnasium, Aesclepion and the Library which once held 200,000 parchment volumes. Its temples of Zeus, Athena, and Trajan are reduced to crumbled foundations. Not far from Pergamum is Troas, where Paul, on his second missionary journey, had the vision in which he was called to Macedonia (Acts 16: 8-13). During his third journey, Paul spent a week preaching in Troas. One evening, Eutychus fell asleep during Paul's preaching and fell to his death from a threestory window, only to be miraculously resurrected by Paul (Acts 20: 6-12).

Day 11 - Troy (Truva) and Istanbul

In **Troy**, history is buried in strata of myth and mud. Once considered only a legend from Homer's epic poem, *The Iliad*, the ruins of historical Troy were discovered by archeologists in the 19th century. Nine layers of the fabled city have since been excavated. Travel on to **Istanbul** via the beautiful **Dardanelles**.

Day 12 — Return to the USA or enjoy an extension...

Day 1 & 2 USA to Turkey

Day 4 & 5 Fly to Cappadocia, where the landscape looks like you've been transported to a distant planet, thanks to the "fairy chimneys." These weathered cones of volcanic rock formed caves and labyrinths which were used by early Christians fleeing persecution. Because the stone hardens when exposed to air, generations have carved dwellings in the soft rock faces, and people still make their homes here. Of the 3,000 rock churches in the region, you will visit the Rock Chapels of Goreme, the Cave Village of Avcilar, and the Monastic Complex of Zelve. On the evening of Day 5, you will overnight in Adana.

Istanbul & Nicaea 2-day Extension - \$628*

Day 12 Begin your exploration of Istanbul with a relaxing two-hour **Bosphorus Cruise**. Glide beneath



the city's famous bridges as you sail past some of Istanbul's colorful neighborhoods and peaceful suburbs. Your boat will take you past castles and quaint fishing villages. As you note Russian ships sailing by, you will understand why the Turkish straits were considered to be the "lock to the Czar's backdoor." Later, you will explore the eastern part of Istanbul with its Byzantine city walls, the Golden Horn, and the world-famous mosaics of the Kariye Church.

Day 13 Discover the lakeside town of Iznik, known in Byzantine times as Nicaea. The first of two church councils held in Nicaea produced the profession of faith known as the Nicene Creed, still memorized by many Christians. Ancient Nicaea's Christian heritage comes to life as you explore the ruins of the Basilica of St. Sophia, the Baptistry, and the Christian Tombs on the outskirts of town.

Day 14 Return to USA.
